I am impressed with how well students are now able to use descriptive words to explain the attributes of different shapes, such as straight lines, corners and curves.

Working on new letters in Fundations...

This week students learned about the sounds made by the vowel a and the consonant g. Both are a little tricky for students to properly form but they did an excellent job practicing how to write these letters. We are also working on rhyming more closely during these next few weeks. Each time we read a story in which students recognize a rhyme, they give a thumbs up when they hear them. That is a fun activity to try at home as well when you share stories with your children. Rhyming is an important prereading skill for all Kindergarten students.

Playing Cards with Our Buddies!

On Wednesday, our buddies taught the students how to play a fun card game called "Garbage!" It helps students practice counting the numbers 1-10 in a new way. We will continue to play it in our classroom all year long. Ask your child to teach it to you. You only need a deck of cards.

Exploring Colors...

Students wove placemats for our upcoming Kindergarten feast. They did a great job creating beautiful patterns with colorful paper. They also painted vivid watercolor sunsets based on *The Legend of the Indian Paintbrush* by Tomie dePaola, a story we listened to with Ms. Stewart's class on Friday. It was interesting to learn about the ways Native Americans could create beautiful paint colors from natural resources.
