This week we spent a lot of time practicing how to write the numerals 1-10. Number formation can be challenging for K friends but they are working hard. Dr. Price, our Math specialist, joined us this week to teach us fun rhymes to help recal how to form the numbers. Ask your children to show you how well they are doing with their numbers! ©

This week in Literacy...

We studied the letters C and O this week. So far we have focused on nine letters: B,C,F,I,M,N,O,T, and U. The students are doing an excellent job practicing letter sounds, which is especially tricky with the vowels we are now learning. They are also doing well writing some of their lower case letters. This week the students did rainbow writing, using crayons to practice forming the lower case letters in their student notebooks. We also illustrated a story about Echo, the owl puppet we use in *Fundations*, as a whole class. The students are practicing being able to retell a story in the proper sequence, recalling what happened at the beginning, middle, and end.


Saying Thank You to our Veterans.
