# Having Fun with Math!

This week in Math we played our Top It! game (which is like the card game *War*) with number cards. The challenge after we flipped over the cards was to determine which number was larger. Students knew they could use number lines, our Days in School number line or even the class calendar to figure it out. We also realized we could use a number grid to count by 5's or 10's or count on from a number!

This week we studied the letters Q and Z to finish up learning the sounds that all of the letters in the alphabet make. We talked about how Q can be tricky because when we see Q in a word, it always comes before its best friend U. The students completed Q/Z sorts and did a great job stretching out the sounds they heard in the words. They also made Question Mark and Zucchini class books and brainstormed lots of words that start with Q and Z. Next week we will begin to work on blending sounds into words on a daily basis. The students are excited to practice this skill. Many are already exploring how to do this as they read some of the books in our classroom library.

## Celebrating the Hour of Code!

On Wednesday, we celebrated the Hour of Code! All of Willard School participated in various coding activities throughout the day. In our room, the students worked in pairs on the iPads to write code for simple puzzles and an Angry Birds video game. Some codes had up to 6 or 7 lines at a time – they did an awesome job!
