Our class had so much fun this week celebrating the works of Dr. Seuss while practicing many important pre-reading skills such as blending, segmenting and rhyming. We did many fun activities such as painting beautiful fish to create a colorful bulletin board entitled: "One fish, two fish, Willard fish are cool fish!" Students also did straw paintings of Thing 1 and Thing 2 and created funny Cat in the Hat masks. Today the students went on a green egg scavenger hunt. Each student received an egg half with a simple word on it. They had to hunt through our classroom to find the other egg half with a rhyming word. Our Latest Science Experiments...

Our investigation into the properties of wood this week led to a new experiment. The question we posed is: How can we make wood sink? The students discovered that they could make the wood sink using paper clips and rubber bands, but that certain kinds of wood are heavier than others because it took less paper clips to sink plywood than it did pine. It was a great realization.
