

Having Fun with Math!

This week we continued working on joining stories, using manipulatives such as dominoes to practice adding numbers together. We also played "Frog Hop" on a life-sized game board where students rolled dice and then told classmates to hop forward or backward on the number line depending on whether it was a plus or minus number.

In addition, students spent time working in pairs to create surveys to administer to all of their classmates and then design graphs to display the data they collected. It was impressive to see the children discussing how to best explain the answers to the questions they asked their classmates. Many of them came up with excellent ways to share the information they had gathered. They are becoming guite a group of mathematicians!

What is a Community?

We began a new unit in Social Studies this week called *Communities*. We discussed what it means to be a part of a community, like in our classroom, our school and our towns. The students brainstormed places we have in a community and today we actually built our own community. Ask your child about it. We are going to add to it on Monday.
